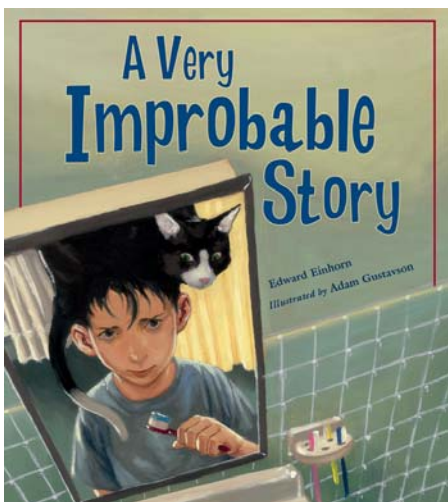

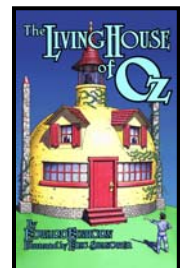


The Living House of Oz
